Angel Food Ministries is a non-profit, non-denominational organization dedicated to providing grocery relief and financial support to communities throughout the United States. Angel Food cost \$30 a box with no secondhand items or damaged goods. Each month's menu is different than the previous month and consists of both fresh and frozen items. Comparison shopping done across the country has resulted in the same food items retailing between \$42 and \$78. One unit of food assists in feeding a family of four for about one week or a single senior citizen for almost a month. Also offered are specialty boxes such as steaks, chicken and pork.

The ToolBank is the largest nonprofit tool lending program in the U.S., founded and based in Atlanta. We only deal with nonprofits and community groups. Membership dues are based on the agency's annual budget. Fees to borrow tools for two weeks are 6% of retail value. The \$500,000 ToolBank inventory includes more than 150 varieties of carpentry, cleaning, painting and landscape tools. We also have some building materials and hardware that are available to members for a negligible handling fee. The ToolBank is perfectly suited for agencies with large volunteer bases but can outfit any size nonprofit with the tools needed for any size project.

The Women on Board program was designed to increase the participation and diversity of women serving on nonprofit boards in Metro Atlanta. The program works to accomplish this goal by providing effective board governance training to Atlanta women and by acting as an advocate and intermediary between program participants and registered nonprofit organizations. Since its inception, the program has trained over 1,300 women in board governance and leadership skills, placed over 200 women on nonprofit boards and government commissions, and made over 685 referrals for board placement. Currently, there are 276 nonprofit organizations registered with the Woman on Board program.
