

## Jovid Foundation Grants Awarded in 2002

In 2002, the Foundation's grants fell into five areas: Employment and Training Programs and Evaluation; Economic and Poverty Research; Performing Arts; Foundation/Nonprofit Institutional Support; and, Other. In 2002, the Foundation paid 49 grants totaling \$537,500.
